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School Information

Saint Aidan's is a successful and popular 11-16 co-educational Church of England school with 860 students situated in a very pleasant part of the Fylde in Lancashire. We draw our students from a wide area which includes the rural area of Over Wyre, as well as a number of areas on the edge of Blackpool and Fleetwood. The school is within easy reach of the cities of Lancaster and Preston and the town of Blackpool.

Our students achieve very well, and there is a real will in the school to improve even further. In 2019 (the last nationally reported GCSE exams) 53% of students achieved at least grade 5 in GCSE English and Maths and we are regularly one of the highest performing schools on the Fylde peninsula.

The school's commitment to learning extends to staff as well as students; there is a well-developed structure of support for new members of staff and a culture of "lifelong learning" among our teaching and associate staff. Our in-house CPD programme is important to us and we are continually looking to develop innovative approaches to teaching and learning, with an emphasis on the use of modern technology and collaborative learning. All teaching staff have access to a Microsoft Surface Pro laptop, and all of our classrooms are equipped with interactive whiteboards or touch displays. Individual tablet devices are used by students in the classroom.

The school was inspected by Ofsted in October 2013 and was found to be a Good school with Outstanding Behaviour and Safety. This was confirmed by a short inspection in July 2018. inspection by SIAMS in March 2017 found us to be Outstanding in two areas and Good in the other two. The school is full in all year groups, and is regularly oversubscribed for entry into Year 7. The majority of our students travel to us by bus and choose Saint Aidan's over schools nearer their homes because of our individual care for students, our calm and purposeful atmosphere, our high academic standards and our Christian ethos.

As a church school we have a strong emphasis on the provision of a stimulating, secure and caring environment within which all members of our community can develop their potential to the full. Relationships within the school community are characterised by mutual respect; this creates a safe environment where young people can grow and develop, and where learning is valued. There is a strong "vertical" pastoral structure, built around forms that contain students from all five year groups. Our collective worship draws students together staff and encourages them to explore life's big school's issues. The ethos is Christian but is also distinctively inclusive of those of other faiths or none. This gives us a great responsibility as for many of our children Saint Aidan's provides their only experience of worshipping and growing within a Christian community.

We work closely with our local primary schools, sixth forms, FE providers and universities. Further afield the school has many links with partners in Britain and abroad, including strong links with a partner school in South Africa. Students can participate in a wide range of extracurricular activities and educational visits in this country and further afield. All staff are encouraged to contribute to this programme.

Over the last two years Saint Aidan's, like all schools, has constantly adapted to keep students' education and the life of the school going through all of the challenges the pandemic has brought. The close school community and our investment in technology for learning have allowed us to do this better than most. Staff, students and parents have worked together and have shown the qualities that make Saint Aidan's such a great place to work or study.

Our school 'motto' is taken from John 10 v 10 -"I have come that they may have life in all its fullness". All we do at Saint Aidan's is aimed at making this a reality for our students and staff.

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Departmental Information

Modern Foreign Languages Faculty

The Modern Foreign Languages Faculty is well-resourced and located in its own fully equipped building with four classrooms. Students have access to their own personal tablets in lessons where we use a range of apps and websites to enhance language learning. Our pupils have access to our various online language learning apps and subscription courses.

Students at KS3 enjoy 3 hours a week of languages. Year 7 students study one language on entry to Saint Aidan's, currently either Spanish or German for the whole year. Most year 8 and 9 students study two languages, studying 2 hours a week of one language and 1 hour a week of a 2nd language. The language they study for 1 or 2 hours alternates every halfterm. Through our range of resources, KS3 students can learn the language and explore the culture of the countries using 'Viva' for Spanish and 'Stimmt' for German including all online books and resources. We are currently in the process in transitioning to NCELP teaching resources, which we will be using with both year 7 and 8 from September.

We have a very healthy uptake of students at KS4 who opt to study a language, following the AQA Full GCSE course. Students are given the opportunity to further their knowledge of the language incorporating topics on healthy lifestyle, leisure and social issues. They explore new vocabulary and tenses and all lessons include the use of their own tablet devices. There is a strong emphasis on immersing the students in the language and culture of the country.

The Faculty offers a weekly homework clubs for KS3 and 4, a G+T Latin and Greek club, and a Spanish penpal club where some year 8 pupils are building links with a new partner school in Spain. Over the next academic year our residential overseas visits are due to resume with a trip to the Cologne Christmas markets in December and a visit to Barcelona in the summer term. These visits will allow students to experience the wonderful culture and sights of these cities as well as giving them the opportunity to practise their language skills.





I am looking forward to welcoming a new colleague in to our vibrant and forward thinking team. Saint Aidan's is a fantastic school to work at. The MFL department mirrors much of the whole school ethos to build a working environment where I aim to work collaboratively with colleagues in the faculty and our pupils also benefit from this positive ethos and environment. Staff turnover is low (this post is due to a colleague relocating overseas). Therefore, this is quite a rare opportunity to work with such a great team!

At the core of our learning is the ability to build strong, firm and positive relationships students, and communication skills and collaborative learning are at the heart of our teaching and learning. We pride ourselves in the MFL team on the 'buzz' in our classrooms as the students actively participate and submerae themselves language and culture and enjoy their language learning. We work in a positive atmosphere where mutual respect and support are a priority students are actively encouraged to forge relationships with the wider community in other European countries and improve their linguistic skills further.

I will look forward to sharing more information about our fantastic school and faculty with candidates who are invited to interview.
