



Uniform Years 7-10

Maroon jumper embroidered with the school crest.

White standard school shirt and grey and maroon striped tie.

Dark grey school style trousers with dark grey socks OR grey pleated skirt embroidered with the school crest (to be worn just above the knee) with black opaque tights.

Plain black shoes – no trainers, no different coloured logos, no heels higher than 5cm.



Uniform Year 11

Black jumper embroidered with the school crest.

White standard school shirt and grey school crest tie.

Black school style trousers with dark grey or black socks OR black pleated skirt embroidered with the school crest (to be worn just above the knee) with black opaque tights.

Plain black shoes – no trainers, no different coloured logos, no heels higher than 5cm.

BOYS

- red Joma polo shirt
- black Joma shorts

Other Uniform Essentials

- Make up (including false tan) and jewellery are not to be worn (with the exception of a wrist watch and one pair of small stud earrings in the ear lobes). Minimal make up may be used to cover blemishes or skin concerns.
- False nails, false eyelashes or similar are not appropriate for school and should not be worn.
- A white polo shirt with the embroidered school crest may be worn during the Summer Term.
- Please note that students will not be allowed to wear trainers for school unless a consultant's letter has been shared with school regarding a need for this.



Additional Information

- A uniform consultation, following changes in government policy, will take place during the 2025/2026 school year. In the meantime, students in Years 7-10 may choose wear black trousers instead of the usual school grey that is usually standard.
- Skirts should be of a 'professional' length which is appropriate and suitable for the school environment and should, therefore, sit no higher than 'just above the knee'.
- Girls should wear formal trousers and not leggings. Trousers that are sold as 'active wear' or 'yoga pants' are not acceptable for school. Students should not wear jogging bottoms or jeans as school trousers. School trousers will usually have a thick waistband and will usually have an obvious seam either at the side or the front of the trouser. They will usually have a zip or button (or pretend zip/button). Some photos of appropriate trousers are shown below.
- Uniform checks will be completed regularly and students not complying may be asked to wear an item provided by school. Students may not be able to attend lessons if they refuse to comply with the school uniform rules. We currently have stock of skirts (in a range of sizes and longer lengths), girls and boys trousers, ties and shirts as well as school shoes and new tights which we can provide to students as required.
